# Principal's Message

#### **OSHC** update

As you may be aware, our OSHC provider Happy Haven terminated their contract during the school holidays. Since then I have been working with the Department for Education's OSHC Unit to have another provider deliver an OSHC service to our community. This process is a lengthy one. What I can tell you is that the people responsible for supporting schools set up an OSHC service are doing all that they can to ensure that we have a service as soon as is humanly possible with all the constraints of setting up a new service (essentially a new business) and Government procedures that are involved. Everyone involved is doing their best to ensure that we get a viable service that is best for our community and most importantly our students/children. Usually this process can take up to 90 days. Given our circumstances, I am confident it will be considerably less than that, however I am unable to provide a definite start date. As soon as I am given that date, I will inform you immediately. Thank you for your support and patience with a trying and less than ideal situation.

#### Year 6 High School applications

#### Student Free Day

On Monday 1st May, staff participated in professional learning at school. The day was split into three sessions, with staff engaging in targeted professional learning that was determined by the year levels in which they primarily work with and support.

The R-2 teachers also attended two sessions with their first one being on Formative and summative assessment/moderation, presented by Sheree Wingard and their second session on Orthographic mapping and 'The trick to getting tricky words into long term memory' and therefore not being tricky.

Mr Hunter and I worked with the Specialist Teachers on how they can ensure they are best supporting the needs of all our learners across the school, given they work with every student in the school.


The final session of the day consisted of teachers finalising their plans for the term ahead.
