## Principal's Message

#### SSO Week

#### **Class Placements for 2024**

#### Phonics Screen Check Data

Each year, students in Year I participate in the Department's Phonics Screen Check assessment. The data obtained from that assessment, informs schools and teachers where the students are at in terms of their development in phonics and where the teaching and intervention (if required) needs to be targeted to meet the needs of each individual student. At Munno Para PS, since 2020 we have had a particular focus as part of our Site Improvement Plan work on strengthening our teaching of phonics and phonological awareness in the Junior Primary. This year, the students have performed exceptionally well again. I would like to formally acknowledge and congratulate all our Year I students on an outstanding effort and to our junior primary teachers and SSOs who continue to strengthen and improve their knowledge and skills so they can give our students to best opportunities for success. Finally, thank you to our families who have supported their child's education by reading with them at home, practising their sight and tricky words and working with us as we strive for growth for every child in every class.

#### Uniforms

As the weather begins to warm up can I please remind all families of our school dress code expectations. It is important that all students adhere to the policy so they can be identified as students of Munno Para PS. This is particularly important when they are playing on the oval during recess and lunch.

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## SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY (amended Feb 2022)

Wearing of the Munno Para Primary School uniform is compulsory for all students in Reception through to Year 6. School uniform is important because:

- we know immediately if there are strangers on campus
- it encourages student pride in themselves and their school
- it enhances our public image and identity
- reduces peer pressure
- provides families with a cost effective option for school clothing

By attending this school, students are agreeing to wear school uniform, and parents are agreeing to ensure that their students have access to the school uniform.

<u>SCHOOL SHOES</u> For health and safety reasons students are required to wear sneakers, sport shoes or closed in shoes at all times.

<u>HATS</u> At MPPS we value sun safe practices. 'No hat no play' policy is enforced all year. Students are required to wear a Munno Para Primary School hat when:

- They are playing outside
- They participate in any outside lessons
- They are on excursions which are held outdoors

Students without a hat or who choose not to wear a hat will be directed by our staff to move into a shaded area. Hats are not to be worn inside any of our school buildings.

<u>JEWELLERY</u> Whilst many students wear jewellery outside of school, many types of jewellery can pose a safety hazard within the day to day school activities.

Jewellery that is permitted include:

- Small sleeper earrings, although we recommend studs as an alternative as little fingers can get caught in sleepers resulting in earlobes being torn
- Small stud earrings
- A watch

All other jewellery is not to be worn at school. Students who do so will be asked to remove it and place it in their school bags. Some students may have significant religious, cultural or medical requirements where it is important to wear certain items. If this applies to you please arrange a time to discuss this with one of the leadership team members.

<u>HAIR</u> that is below the collar needs to be tied back. This can assist in the prevention of and transmission of head lice. It is also a safety issue with students involved in physical activities throughout the day.

MAKE UP is not permitted, students wearing make-up will be asked to remove it. No coloured nail polish is permitted

## PROCESS FOR STUDENTS NOT WEARING SCHOOL UNIFORM

- 1. Reminder (in class)
- 2. Incorrect Uniform notice sent home (in class)
- 3. Student spoken to by leadership in office and phone call will be made home regarding the correct uniform being brought to school (leadership Students not allowed to play on oval)

\* Students who do not regularly wear school uniform will not be considered for off-site excursions.

## RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

- Green and yellow collared shirts with the Munno Para Primary School Logo
- The only acceptable alternative is plain bottle green collared shirts
- Plain black shorts, skirts or shorts (mid-length or longer) or plain long black pants (no stripes or patterns)
  No denim



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- Green and white gingham summer dress, mid-length or longer
- Plain bottle green or black long sleeved top to be worn under school T shirt
- Green and Yellow Munno Para School Jacket or plain bottle green jacket
- Shoes: enclosed shoes such as sneakers / joggers / flat, closed in sandals
- Hat: Munno Para Primary School bucket / wide brimmed hat, plain black or green hat no caps or logos

#### Year 6 only in **addition** to the items above

The following is information is from DFE 'School Uniform Procedures'.

4.1 Legislation

Pursuant to Regulation 86 of the Education Regulations 2012 the school council of a school may-

(a) In accordance with any administrative instructions issued by the Minister as described above; and

(b) After consulting with parents and students of the school in accordance with any administrative instructions issued by the Minister as described above and having regard to their views, may determine a dress code for the school. 4.2 School Dress Code

A school dress code is the documented standards of what is acceptable in relation to the clothing worn by students at the school.

A school dress code can be applied to all students of the school or a specific section of the student body, and can include a range of clothing for students, which can be in form of a school uniform, colour code or mix and match clothing.

4.9 Enforcement and Non-Compliance

The head teacher will enforce the dress code of the school and may take appropriate disciplinary action in relation to wilful and persistent breach of that dress code.
