Parking/Way2Go Program

The Way2Go program is commencing this year and this partnership will help support the construction of an Emu Crossing on Maltarra Road. The Way2Go program is a statewide South Australian program promoting active, safe and green travel for primary school children and families. It is built on a partnership between local councils, school communities and the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT).

This year Chloe Matz (K4) will be our teacher advocate and ambassador for the program. We will be working together to ensure the program rolls out smoothly.

In the meantime, we would like to emphasise the importance of parking safely and following the road rules when picking up your child.

We kindly ask all parents and guardians:

- 1. Park only in designated areas, and avoid blocking driveways or access points.
- 2. Follow the directions of school staff and any posted signs.

Your cooperation helps to create a safe environment for our students and the entire school community.

NAPLAN

What is NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

How can you support your child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests; however, it is not necessary for parents/carers to do this. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

<u>Testing</u>

Testing for this year's NAPLAN commences next week from Wednesday 12 March. NAPLAN coordinators and test administrators have been busy in the background completing training and developing resources for the successful implementation of NAPLAN. Good luck to all our NAPLAN participants this year, we are confident your years of schooling will have prepared you well for this challenge.

It was a really fun event and enabled our families, staff and students to strengthen their existing relationships and foster a strong sense of community. 

These events have been celebrated for many years, aiming to raise awareness, acceptance, and appreciation of neurodiverse individuals.




Lastly, a special note for our Year 5 and Year 6 students-


